17 Plaintiff alleges as follows:

18 1. Plaintiff is an individual who is and at all times
19 mentioned herein was an individual residing in the City of Los
20 Angeles, State of California.

21 2. Defendant CITY OF LOS ANGELES (hereinafter CITY) is
22 and at all times mentioned herein was a municipal corporation
23 organized and existing under the Constitution and Laws of the
24 State of California.

25 3. Plaintiff is and has been an avid collector of books,
26 documents, and ephemera as a hobby. Items acquired and
27 purchased are for Plaintiff's personal use and not for resale,
28 even though Plaintiff may recycle and/or donate duplicates or

1 unwanted items. Plaintiff does not hold himself out as a
2 business or occupation with regard to his collecting and hobby
3 activities.

4 4. Plaintiff actively promotes, advertises, and campaigns
5 his collecting and hobby activities within publications,
6 websites, and at various events and locations, including, but
7 not limited to, exhibitions, festivals, meetings, flea markets,
8 swap meets, trade shows, garage sales, and collector meetings.

9 5. Plaintiff wants to have an "exhibitor's table" or
10 "buying booth" within the City of Los Angeles at various events
11 such as those described in paragraph 4, at which Plaintiff is
12 seeking to inform and let know to the participants, other
13 exhibitors, attendees, and the public who Plaintiff is as a
14 collector and hobbyist who purchases books, documents, and
15 ephemera.

16 6. Plaintiff does not and has not engaged in any business
17 nor occupation as a secondhand book dealer, secondhand seller,
18 pawnshop, antique merchant, antique shop, pawn broker, or seller
19 of any kind of books, documents, and ephemera. Plaintiff merely
20 collects and seeks to reach a larger audience with regard to
21 Plaintiff's collecting, and the items and subjects in which
22 Plaintiff has an interest.

23 7. The CITY has enacted a series of ordinances as part of
24 the Municipal Code for the City of Los Angeles relating to the
25 regulation of secondhand book dealers and secondhand dealers.
26 The pertinent parts of the relevant ordinances are Municipal
27 Codes §§103.310, §103.301. These ordinances have been since
28 their enactment, and are now still in full force and effect and

1 are being enforced and utilized by Defendant, CITY, through
2 their many agencies, including, but not limited to the Los
3 Angeles Police Department.

4 8. The employees of the CITY's Police Department have
5 stated that the Plaintiff is a secondhand book dealer and as
6 such is a business, thus requiring him to comply with, apply
7 for, obtain, and maintain a local police permit as a business.
8 Defendant considers Plaintiff's collecting and hobby activities
9 as an unpermitted business and that will lead to Plaintiff being
10 subjected to arrest and prosecution.

11 9. According to the CITY, Plaintiff is required to
12 maintain a secondhand book dealer's permit to purchase any
13 books, documents or ephemera at all public and private sales
14 including, but not limited to, the following venues:

- 15 a. Storage Auctions
- 16 b. Personal Property Sales
- 17 c. Receivership Sales
- 18 d. UCC Foreclosure Sales
- 19 e. Sheriff's Sales
- 20 f. Swap Meets
- 21 g. Flea Markets
- 22 h. Garage Sales
- 23 i. Trustee Bankruptcy Sales
- 24 j. Abandonment Sales
- 25 k. Ebay.com, Amazon.com, etc. (internet websites)
- 26 l. Public Administrator Auctions
- 27 m. Treasury Auctions
- 28 n. Probate Auctions

1 o. Conservatorship Auctions

2 p. Estate Sales

3 q. Police Auctions

4 r. Divorce Liquidation Sales

5 10. An actual controversy has arisen and now exists
6 between Plaintiff and Defendant, CITY, relative to their
7 respective rights and duties. Plaintiff contends that the
8 ordinances are invalid and unenforceable as to him and his
9 collecting and hobby activities, being preempted by a State Law
10 that the Plaintiff is NOT required to apply for, obtain, and
11 maintain a secondhand dealer's permit.

12 11. Plaintiff contends that upon enactment of the
13 California State Statutory System which regulates secondhand
14 dealers, including, but not limited to secondhand book dealers,
15 the local regulatory ordinances are preempted. Defendant
16 disputes this contention and contends the local regulatory
17 ordinances are valid and that Plaintiff is a business even
18 though the California Department of Justice and the City of Los
19 Angeles, Office of Finance¹ has made a written determination and
20 conclusion otherwise.

21 12. The actual controversy which exists includes, but is
22 not limited to, the following:

- 23 a. The Municipal Code provides that a violation of
24 the Ordinances challenged herein, expose
25 Plaintiff to criminal prosecution under Municipal
26 Code §21.199(h).

27

1 b. If Plaintiff does not maintain a local regulatory
2 license and permit to engage in book documents,
3 and ephemera collecting, the CITY contends
4 Plaintiff may not engage in book documents, and
5 ephemera collecting as a hobby. Plaintiff is
6 required to procure a regulatory license and
7 permit under threat of criminal prosecution. The
8 City has been forwarded copies of the California
9 Department of Justice letter dated June 12, 2008,
10 and City of Los Angeles, Office of Finance letter
11 dated April 3, 2008.

12 c. Plaintiff may be subject to regular and
13 unannounced warrantless searches of non-public
14 areas of Plaintiff's residential premises by CITY
15 employees, not permitted by State law, under of
16 threat criminal prosecution of Plaintiff.

17 d. Plaintiff has been and is presently being exposed
18 by the CITY to threat of criminal prosecution.
19 Plaintiff has been denied administrative review
20 of his request due to the lack of procedures
21 established by the CITY to redress his request.
22 The CITY has and continues to refuse to provide a
23 written determination.

24 e. Plaintiff cannot seek review of any
25 administrative ruling, or lack thereof, but seeks
26 a legal determination of whether he is required
27 to submit to such ordinances and permit
28 requirements.

1 f. These unwarranted and arbitrary actions by CITY's
2 employees subject Plaintiff to potential criminal
3 prosecution; a violation and interference of
4 Plaintiff's free exercise of his right guaranteed
5 under the First and Fourteenth Amendment of the
6 United States Constitution and applicable
7 sections of the California Constitution.

8 g. Defendant, CITY, subjectively stated Plaintiff's
9 collecting and hobby actives are a business, thus
10 subject to the rules, duties, and regulations of
11 a secondhand book dealer. Failure to maintain a
12 secondhand book dealer permit will subject
13 Plaintiff to criminal prosecution.

14 13. Plaintiff has no alternative other than seeking a
15 declaration of his rights and duties in this Court.

16 14. Plaintiff has been and continues to be subject to
17 criminal enforcement of the local ordinances, all of which
18 Plaintiff alleges are preempted by State law. Plaintiff has no
19 other alternative or speedy remedy for determination of his
20 rights.

21 15. The CITY disputes that the City of Los Angeles
22 Municipal Code Ordinances challenged herein are preempted by
23 State law and CITY contends that each and every ordinance and
24 its application to Plaintiff's activities are valid.

25 16. Plaintiff desires a judicial determination as to the
26 validity of the ordinances and the question of their being
27 preempted by State law.

28 17. A judicial declaration is necessary and appropriate at

1 this time so that Plaintiff may ascertain his rights and duties
2 in the matter without first subjecting himself to liability by
3 violating the ordinances including the potential for criminal
4 prosecution.

5 18. Plaintiff further submits that it would be appropriate
6 for resolution at this time in order to avoid irrepressible
7 injury which will result to Plaintiff by the continued criminal
8 prosecution of Plaintiff by the CITY under their local
9 ordinances at significant expense unless the determination in
10 made.

11 WHEREFORE, Plaintiff prays for judgment as follows:

12 1. That this Court accept jurisdiction over this case and
13 schedule it for hearing at the soonest opportunity.

14 2. That this Court declares Plaintiff is not a secondhand
15 book dealer, secondhand seller, pawnshop, antique merchant,
16 antique shop, pawn broker, or seller of any kind of books,
17 documents, and ephemera or secondhand goods and wares, nor
18 conducting a business nor occupation with regard to his
19 collecting and hobby activities.

20 3. That this Court declares the ordinances in question
21 are preempted by State law, and as such are invalid and void as
22 to Plaintiff's collecting and hobby activities.

23 4. That this Court declares the respective rights and
24 duties of the parties under the ordinances in question.

25 5. That this Court declares that the actions of Defendant
26 in denying Plaintiff's right to collect books, documents, and
27 ephemera is *ultra vires* and unlawful according to the laws and
28 regulations of the City of Los Angeles.

1 6. That this Court issues a preliminary and permanent
2 injunction restraining Defendant from prohibiting Plaintiff from
3 actively promoting, publicizing, and advertising, his collecting
4 and hobby activities within publications, websites, and at
5 various events and locations, including, but not limited to,
6 exhibitions, festivals, meetings, flea markets, swap meets,
7 trade shows, garage sales, and collector meetings within the
8 jurisdiction of the City of Los Angeles.

9 7. That this Court declares enjoining Defendant, their
10 employees, agents, and successors in office from enforcing the
11 City of Los Angeles Ordinances, or in the alternative, enjoin
12 Defendant, their employees, agents, and successors in office
13 from enforcing the City of Los Angeles Ordinances against
14 Plaintiff's books, documents, and ephemera collecting and hobby
15 activity as described herein.

16 8. That this Court declares the City of Los Angeles
17 Ordinance(s) to be in violation of the United States
18 Constitution and applicable sections of the California
19 Constitution, or in the alternative declaring that the
20 application of the City of Los Angeles Ordinance to Plaintiff's
21 books, documents, and ephemera collecting and hobby activity as
22 described herein, violates Plaintiff's Federal and State
23 constitutional rights.
